Project Profiles

Supporting the Intersection Between Health Care and Public Health

The Center faculty and staff work on over 40 projects, many exemplify population health by intervening at the intersection of health care and public health.

The following three projects are current examples of partnerships in healthcare with interventions in public health and prevention.

Healthy Choices

In partnership with Sixteenth Street Community Health Center, CUPH staff have initiated an evaluation of their bilingual Healthy Choices program.

Healthy Choices aims to empower patients and community members to participate in a program to adopt healthier eating patterns and more active lifestyles. The program assists individuals and families in building capacity for making health minded decisions for the incorporation of more physical activity in their daily lives and selecting more healthy food items without increasing their budget. The program attempts to increase the family and community connections of individuals as a way to decrease stress levels, which has been linked to overeating and obesity. The SSCHC patients and community members are referred to this lifestyle intervention. The program is family focused and splits the family by age, providing the same information to each group but in age and language appropriate methods.

The Center has designed and is implementing the evaluation of the program and is convening an advisory group to review the program curriculum against current nutrition science and evidence.

Health Outcomes and Patient Engagement (HOPE) Research Collaborative

Obesity, a preventable illness, accounts for an estimated \$147 billion in medical care annually. Obesity is specifically associated with heart disease, hypertension and diabetes. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 62.8% of Milwaukee residents are overweight or obese. Ethnic and racial minority groups are disproportionately affected by obesity, particularly African American; 36.8% of African American are obese, compared to 25.2% of whites. Interventions have shown limited success at weight reduction in patients from these populations. Disparities in obesity rates are affected, in part, by the lack of comprehensive, patient-centered, culturally competent, treatment options, especially interventions based in urban, primary care settings.

With the general purpose of improving healthcare delivery and addressing health disparities, a team of researchers representing multiple disciplines and institutions have been working to develop MyLIFE: A patient-centered obesity intervention for African American women. MyLife proposes to examine the effect of a patient-centered obesity intervention that addresses both individual and community resource issues. Clinically, patients will be engaged in a multidisciplinary manner in areas of primary care, behavioral health, exercise and nutrition.

Dementia Wellness Project for Underserved African American Elders

Alzheimer's disease (AD) is the most common cause of dementia, accounting for 60-80% of cases. Presently, about 1 in 9 seniors in the US (1 in 7 in Wisconsin) have AD. Currently, 65% of Wisconsin's 74,000 nursing home residents have dementia, mostly due to AD and the estimated cost of Medicaid-supported long-term care for Wisconsin residents with AD was about \$1.6 billion in 2010.

Because AD is primarily a disease of old age, its prevalence and associated cost are projected to increase exponentially given the unprecedented expansion in the elder segment of the US population. African American baby boomers are at higher risk than non-Hispanic White of similar ages for AD or other dementias. The prevalence of AD and other dementias among older African Americans is roughly double that among non-Hispanic Whites, and is significantly higher than that among Hispanics.

In partnership with Milwaukee Health Services, Inc. (MHSI) and the Wisconsin Alzheimer's Institute, (WAI) this program aims to improve the health and well-being of underserved urban elders and their families by addressing health behaviors, (diet, exercise, stress management, smoking and medication adherence) access to care, (medical home-based coordinated care by Milwaukee Health Services Inc.) and social and economic factors (culturally tailored education and family support). This project expands the service and the activities of the WAI and MHSI dementia diagnostic clinic.

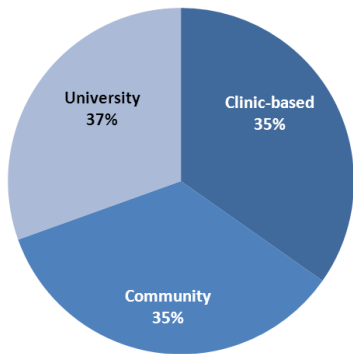

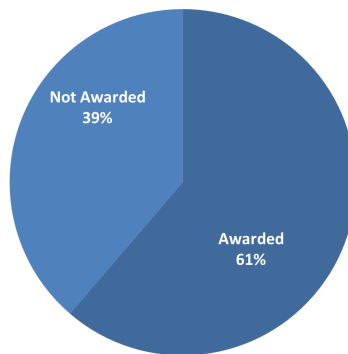
